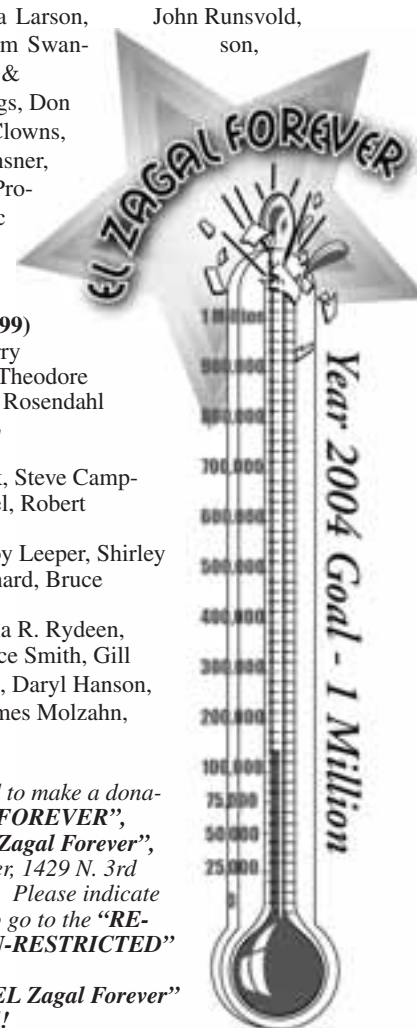

# FUND-RAISING ACTIVITIES

It is natural to associate the fez with Shriners Hospitals for Children. Because of this, meticulous attention must be given to all fund-raising activities, including circuses. To make certain that such activities comply with the law of the land and that a contributor is not led to believe that his money will be used for the Hospitals when all or a portion thereof will be used otherwise. The integrity of our charity and of our fraternity must remain above reproach.

Your specific attention is called to the following fraternal and charitable bylaws:

### §335.3 USE OF NAME "SHRINERS HOSPITALS FOR CHILDREN."

The use of the name "Shriners Hospitals for Children" or reference to the Hospitals in connection with any fund-raising activity by a temple or Noble without the written consent of the Imperial Potentate and the Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Hospitals is prohibited.

§503.10 The use of the name "Shriners Hospitals for Children" or reference to the hospitals in connection with any commercial product or business enterprise is prohibited unless the written consent of the Board of Directors and Trustees has been first obtained.

Now, therefore, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

#### 1. Fund Raising for Fraternal Purposes

- No Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), club, unit, organization of Nobles or affiliated or appendant corporations, shall engage in any fund-raising activity without the express written consent of the potentate of the temple having jurisdiction thereof.
- There can be no representation, express or implied, that the proceeds will be for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children.
- The temple potentate shall carefully examine all phases of the advertising, promotion and solicitation to determine that it complies with §335.3 and §503.10 of the fraternal and charitable bylaws.
- The temple potentate must approve the terms and provisions of any contract for a fund-raising activity after receiving the advice of the temple attorney, and additionally, as may be required by the temple bylaws.
- A copy of the temple potentate's written consent shall be mailed to the Imperial Recorder. Further, such written material pertaining to the fund-raising activity, as requested by the Imperial Recorder, shall be promptly mailed to him.

#### 2. Fund Raising for Charitable Purposes

- No Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), club, unit, organization of Nobles or affiliated or appendant corporations shall engage in any charitable fund-raising activity other than for Shriners Hospitals for Children. Permission therefor must be first obtained in writing from the temple potentate. The temple potentate must then obtain written permission from the Imperial Potentate and the Chairman of the Board of Trustees. This request for written permission shall be sent to the Executive Vice President, International Shrine Headquarters. P.O. Box 31356, Tampa, FL 33631-3356.
- 100% of net proceeds (as defined in the Charitable Fund Raising-Approval And Reporting provisions of this General Order) from charitable fund raising must be given to Shriners Hospitals for Children except for such portion thereof as may be permitted to be retained for the temple Shrine Hospital Patient Transportation Fund, pursuant to the Special Purpose Funds provisions of this General Order.

- The temple shall report the result of each charitable fund raising activity within sixty days of the activity, pursuant to the Charitable Fund Raising Approval And Reporting provision of this General Order.
  - This section shall not apply to activities exempt under §335.4(b) of the bylaws of The Imperial Council.
  - Each independent corporation or entity that receives the permission of the Imperial Potentate and the Chairman of the Board of Trustees to raise money for Shriners Hospitals for Children, and which does not have its financial accounts audited pursuant to §334.5 & §337.8 of the bylaws of The Imperial Council, shall have its financial accounts audited by a certified, chartered or licensed public accountant and shall submit such audit report to The Imperial Council within 120 days of the activity.
3. Statement of Purpose and Disclosure
- Every fund-raising activity must contain factual information on its solicitation material, tickets, programs and documents regarding the use of the proceeds.
- Examples: "Proceeds are for the benefit of (\_\_\_ Temple) (\_\_\_ shrine club) activities."  
"Proceeds are for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children."
- Every fund-raising activity which is not entirely for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children shall prominently state on the solicitation material, tickets and documents that "payments are not deductible as charitable contributions."
  - There must be compliance with the Revenue Act of 1987 provision of any existing general order by U.S. temples.

#### 4. Compliance with Applicable Laws

It is the responsibility of the temple potentate, after receiving the advice of the temple attorney, to determine that there is compliance with all applicable laws in its jurisdiction for the temple's fund-raising activities.

#### 5. Financial Records


- The temple shall maintain detailed financial records pertaining to all fund-raising activities involving Nobles, clubs, units, organizations of Nobles or affiliated or appendant corporations. Details of all revenues and disbursements shall be maintained in such financial records.
- The temple must retain such detailed financial records for a period of seven (7) years.
- There must be compliance with Financial Reporting on *Charitable Funds and Activities* provision of any existing general order.

#### 6. Notification to Nobility

A copy of the Fund-Raising Activities provisions of this General Order shall be printed in the temple publication at least once every calendar year. If there is no temple publication, then a copy shall be mailed to each Noble in the temple not later than the last day in March of each calendar year.

#### 7. Discipline

Any officer, Noble or temple which violates a provision of Fund-Raising Activities is subject to discipline pursuant to the bylaws of The Imperial Council.

**A**s summer approaches, grass everywhere will be in need of attention. To ensure safe lawn mowing, Shriners Hospitals for Children are alerting parents that safety precautions should be followed.

Shriners Hospitals treat many children each year who have been seriously injured as a result of power lawnmower accidents. Many of these incidents result in the loss of fingers, toes, limbs and even eyes. Tragically, some lawnmower accidents can result in permanent brain damage or even death.

According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), in 2003, there were more than 70,000 emergency room treated injuries associated with power lawnmowers. Between 2001-2003 there were an average of 586 emergency room visits each year due to riding lawnmower back-over/run-over incidents involving children under 15 years of age.

One in every five lawnmower deaths involves a child, according to the CPSC, and it estimates that most of the deaths occur when a child is in the path of a moving mower. Although tragic, these unfortunate situations could have been avoided, if adults had taken the proper precautions.

To prevent injuries to children and adults from lawnmower accidents, please follow these safety tips from Shriners Hospitals and the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission:

- \* Do not allow passengers on a riding mower.
- \* Keep children out of the yard and indoors while mowing the lawn.
- \* It is recommended that children under the age of 14 not be allowed to operate a lawnmower.
- \* Always prepare your lawn for mowing. Check your lawn for items such as sticks, rocks, toys, etc. Make sure nothing is hidden in the grass.
- \* Handle fuel with care. Wipe up spills. Never fill the tank on a mower that is hot. Never smoke or use any kind of flame around gasoline.
- \* Wear appropriate clothing and shoes. Wear long pants, long-sleeved shirts, eye protection and heavy gloves. Wear sturdy, close-toed shoes with slip-resistant rubber soles.
- \* Check guards and shields. Be sure to read the owner's manual and know how to operate the equipment. Don't remove or disable guards or other safety devices.
- \* Use a mower with an automatic blade cut-off. Stay behind the handle until the blade stops. Never reach under a mower while it is still operating. If you need to remove debris or check the blade, disconnect the wire from the spark plug.
- \* Don't cut grass when it's wet.
- \* On slopes, mow up and down rather than across the slope.

# EDITORIAL:

## Good news, bad news...but we can succeed!

Two years ago we faced a serious and challenging problem—the possibility that the Minneapolis Shriners Hospital for Children could be closed, as well as several other Shriners Hospitals, which were also planned to be closed following the closing of the Minneapolis Hospital.

Through countless hours of hard work by many Nobles throughout North America the resolution to close the Minneapolis Hospital was defeated.

Because of the potential closure, very few new patients were accepted into the Minneapolis Shriners Hospital system, which created a new challenge — increasing the patient load for the Minneapolis Hospital. After all isn't this our Mission Statement in the first place?

Many of the Shrine Centers throughout the MSA have scheduled screening clinics, which have made a significant impact on increasing the patient load. El Zagal recently scheduled a screening clinic where 56 children were screened and 42 were accepted into the Shriners' Hospital system.

With the Minneapolis Shrine Hospital open for business and our patient load increasing, we now have another challenge to face — **our transportation fund is in serious trouble.**

As of the end of June we had approximately \$10,000 left in our transportation fund, which could possibly be used in July.

In the last 6 months of 2004, we needed approximately \$40,000 for our patient transportation and housing needs. Now we must factor in our 42 new patients. Estimating two visits per patient between now and the end of December, could cost another \$20,000. This parlay into a \$50,000 shortfall for the transportation fund by the end of 2005.

The Minneapolis Shrine Hospital is open and we are finding patients; however, getting them there is our new challenge.

Over the past years the Ada Shrine Club, Vikings and the Detroit Lakes Color Guard have had a great impact on fulfilling our transportation funding needs. After the Ada Shrine Club discontinued gaming we lost more than \$30,000 per year for the transportation fund.

Nobles, we need to start planning ahead. What if the Vikings and Color Guard lose their gaming sites? Where will our transportation funds come from?

It is time for all units to step up to the plate and not leave the bulk of the responsibility on two units.

Each unit should schedule some type of fundraiser during the year, with proceeds are totally dedicated to the Transportation Fund.

We have 22 units in El Zagal with two units involved in gaming.

If the other 20 units raised \$2,000 with a special fundraiser we would meet our annual transportation fund needs.

If you take offense to this plea than maybe you need to ask yourself — *Why am I a Shriners?*

It's all about the kids. Nobles, we can never forget that.

Now I ask all the units to step up to the plate in the last 6 months with a special fundraiser for the kids.

The Shrine Hospitals are there to help our kids. **We need your help to get them there.**

The need for money is not a short-term problem. It will be a problem we will be facing every year.

Units, plan an annual fundraiser dedicating all funds to the Transportation Fund with a goal of raising \$2,000.

The bulk of the responsibility to fund our transportation should not fall on two units, the kids need your help, it's that simple.

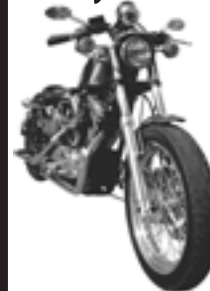

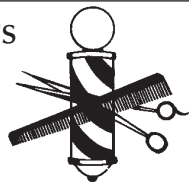
