

Shrine Healthcare Update

Things are starting to move quickly on our new mission to help children. As many of you know, we are the first of many hospitals making the transition to a clinic model. This is due to the changing nature of healthcare in general and more specifically surgery. It is all part of a new focus of more kids, more often in more places.

Bids are in on purchasing the current location. All of that is being handled by the home office in Tampa.

In mid-July the TC Board will be touring the location of out new clinic. While it is not the location originally preferred by your TC Board, I know that our dedicated staff can succeed where Imperial selected. The new site is raw land located in Woodbury, an eastern suburb, 8 miles east of Saint Paul. It is expected that the permits can be obtained without any delay and we could be up and running by July of 2020.

Our surgeries will continue to be done at Gillette Children's Hospital, performed by Shrine doctors.

While we are asking for a third doctor to help with scheduling, "Telehealth" connections have been utilized between the Twin cities and other locations in Shreveport, Honolulu, Philadelphia, Cincinnati and soon with Chicago.

We just wrapped up our first outing of Minnesota Summer Camp for SHC kids near Omaha; over 20 kids were there. Our camps are something very unique to the Twin Cities Shriners' Healthcare.

Also, we hope to meet in Omaha for a celebration to highlight the new, important relationship developed with Boys Town National Research Hospital this August. This cooperation is going to be a template for the rest of SHC as we strive for more kids, more often, more places. Boys Town National Research Hospital is an ideal partner for our mission. We are in discussion for doing something similar in Des Moines, IA.

I have been a big proponent with Tampa that Bismarck

needs to be the priority for our outreach clinics and more. We have two scheduled outreach clinics at the Bone & Joint Clinic on Sept 12 & Oct 17.

This does not mean that the east will be neglected. But we must look at where to target first, for the good of everyone at El Zagal & Kem. In the future, I am hoping to work with Kem Temple and the TC staff to expand our reach for all of us.

In the past we have had hospital days. That has changed, for now, as staffing and location issues are not what they were. We expect to restart this after we are fully operational at the new Woodbury location.

This year we are having a Divan & Hospital Reps day on September 27. I hope that we can have some of us there. As I learn specifics about this I will pass them along. I do apologize if I can't make it, as it looks like I will be in Nashville for business.

This has been a wild ride the first year and a half and I thank you all for your support. Let me tell you, when some little kid sees you in a Fez and reaches up to high five you with a smile on her face, Game Over!

Shrine **Fundraising Association Update**

I recently had the pleasure of attending the Imperial Session in Nashville as a representative of the Shrine Fundraising Association along with association president, Jim Van DeHay. Our reason for going to Nashville was to man an information booth about the association as well as doing a few seminars on different aspects of fundraising. The purpose for this, was to meet and interact with Shriners from throughout Shrinedom to raise awareness of our association and try to get them to become members.

One of my major reasons for running to become an officer of SFA was because this organization has greatly benefited our temple in many ways, and SFA (earlier known as SCFRA) was at risk of coming to an end because of declining membership. Once elected, I found myself in the company of 4 other elected officers who shared my passion for seeing this association, not only survive, but to thrive.

To that end, we put together a strategy of increasing the ability of SFA to better serve our members by providing more knowledge and information while increasing the ease of obtaining that through our quarterly publication, our web site, as well as, our annual seminars.

In addition, in order to increase awareness of SFA and to gain memberships, we sent our officers to regional association meetings, the Oriental Guide/Assistant Rabban School in Tampa and the Imperial Session. These efforts have been quite successful, as we are on track to double our membership from a year ago.

So that is how I came to be manning a SFA booth in Nashville at the Imperial Marketplace. Over the course of 5 days, Jim and I spoke to hundreds of Potentates, Divan members and nobles at large. While we came to showcase the knowledge and information on fundraising that SFA offers its members, there was something else at play here.

At the start, most of our visits were with temples that were doing OK, but were seeking to find ways to improve or increase their fundraisers. But slowly, there came to be more and more temples coming up and telling us stories that were nothing short of heartbreaking. We learned of Shrines whose temple consisted of a rented office with a desk, a phone, a computer and a printer. Temples where the Divan had to rent a conference room in a hotel once a month, just so they had a place to meet. Tales of internal strife, where it seemed that there were Shriners who would rather see their Temple shut its doors rather than have things not go their way.

These temples were not coming to us just for knowledge or information, they were pleading for help to save their temples. After a while, it got to the point where we almost began to feel a little bit like medics on a battlefield.

Overall, it was an amazing experience. I got to reconnect with some old friends, meet some new ones and I got to see what a wonderful city Nashville is. But most importantly, I came away more than a little humbled, but with a sense of increased devotion to the task that now lies before us. That, as important as I once felt that SFA must not come to an end, I feel that it is even more important that we must be there to help those Shriners fighting to keep their temples from coming to an end.
