Then it's off to Las Vegas for Pote Trip 2021! Hole 15 is waiting for those signed up to marshal at the Shriners Children's Open, October


4th thru the 10th. Looking forward to seeing friends we made in 2016 when PP Brad & Lady Barb had us volunteer and make new friends.








TEMPLE WIDE RAFFLE





