

The calendar for November and December isn't quite as busy but still some fun events are going on. November brings the return of Saturday Burgers and Bloody Mary Bar. There is a Circus




December begins with the return of Clown for a Night on Saturday the 4th. Tickets available now! Shrine Kids Christmas Party on Saturday the 11th.


We are getting two new members in Steele Lodge. They were asked why they had never joined before and they said no one had ever asked them.




