
Get Back to Gold in 2023

That brings us to the next group of events. We are very fortunate to still be able to have a Circus. Most of the Temples across Shrinedom have done


away with their Circus. It is still by far our best fundraiser, so get involved and participate as you are able.





Fargo, ND to Lake of the Woods, MN

Risk Free Reservations:

Book by MARCH 30th, a \$300 deposit saves your space. If you should need to cancel for Covid related reasons, your full deposit amount will be placed on account as a credit and can be used for one-year from the original trip date.

Cancellation Trip Protection:

Your final balance of \$370, is due (30-days prior to trip) JUNE 15. Covid related cancellations inside of 30-days get 100% trip credit for one-year from the original trip date.
