





Last week, thousands of people experienced horrors like never before as catastrophic wildfires scorched the Hawaiian island of Maui, killing more than 90 people and destroying most of the historic town of Lahaina. With search-and-recovery efforts ongoing, the death toll is still expected to rise from what are already considered the deadliest U.S. wildfires in more than 100 years.

The most important information is the referral number. 612-596-6105, this is the intake number to Woodbury SC to pass on to the families to call. In the past, us Shriners would make that call. Now, we need to give this number to the families because the nice intake lady will take personal information about where they live, condition they are experiencing and then give it to our nurses in MN to see which SC location best suits their needs to help hem. Simple right!

Keep your eyes wide open. There are many children that would benefit from our help. Keep in mind, MN SC is an orthopaedic clinic but we have many other clinics/hospitals in other states that they may benefit from. Don't let that deter you from referring. Look up shrinerschildrens. org. It will amaze you with all the conditions we treat. From something as simple as foot orthotics to severe burns.

Born to be Mild:

Pelican-based 'biker' gang motored Harley Davidsons across the countryside back in the 1960s

He's the last man standing from a motorcycle gang that rumbled Harley Davidsons down the streets of peaceful, God-fearing communities across the region.

While the machines sounded loud and menacing, gang members weren't leather-clad road warriors. They wore familiar red "Fez" caps, Middle East-influenced attire-like you see at the Shrine circus. And; they waved and smiled a lot.

The Pelican Rapids Shrine Escort Patrol was founded by Len R. Thompson in 1964. Let the record show: Len's son, Lynn Thompson, is the last of this group of civic-minded biker "outlaws."

Little did the Pelican Rapids High School Class of 1958 realize that one of their mates would become a Harley guy. But, Lynn Thompson lived to tell the tale-which he will no doubt share, when the class reunites July 26 at the PelicanVFW.

The patrol was noted for riding in parades throughout the area. Over the years, they performed in Pelican Rapids, Detroit Lakes, Perham, Vergas, Wadena, New York Mills, Barnesville, Rollag (at The Steam Threshers Reunion), Fargo, Moorhead, Stephen, Crookston, Minneapolis, Rapid City, Lisbon, Wahpeton, Winnipeg, Duluth, Grand Forks, Erhard, Elizabeth, Fergus Falls, Menahga, and a number of other towns as well.

To the best of his memory, Lynn recalls that the first engagement was the Looney Days parade in the summer of 1964.

Unlike bikers of another stripe, the Shrine patrol didn't terrorize the local population, bust up saloons, pillage, or plunder.

But they did become quite capable at piloting their Harleys in circles and other formations that delighted parade audiences.

In fact, the only real disruption Lynn recalls was the time he ran his1200 cc Harley into a skunk. A sad day for the skunk, to be sure. But it was the lingering, revolting after-effect that disrupted parade gatherings near and far.

"Every time the engine would warm up, the odor would fill the air," laughed Thompson, who is retired in the Dent area but still a Pelicanite at heart-and frequent visitor.

Most of the gang were members of the Pelican-based Masonic Lodge-and many of the names will be remembered by locals past and present.

Funny thing is, these Pelican area guys made convoy-style Harley-riding respectable long before the attorneys, engineers, educators, and preachers started Motoring down to Sturgis, South Dakota to hang out with Hells Angels.

The Pelican Shriner Patrol included insurance guys like the Thompsons; the hometown doctor; a local grocer; a dentist, an engineer, and various business owners. Plus, there was a future legislator, who was never really scrutinized about his shadowy "biker" past, and the REpublican party's "family values" platform. A dentist, with the nickname "apinless," also rode with the Shriners.

A drug dealer, it should be noted, also rode with the Shrine Escort bikers: Pelican pharmacist Lyle Severson.
