


Things have been pretty quiet with the EMPs over the last month with our monthly meeting being the only happening.

El Zagal Mobil Nobles 1963 – 2023

It is with great sadness that we inform you that the Mobil Nobles have voted to terminate our unit as of the end of December 2023. The above picture was taken at our final meeting where we shared many stories and memories of being part of this great shrine unit.

For some history, the Mobil Nobles were formed in 1963. Most of the original members were traveling salesmen who favored having Friday night as their regular meeting. We continued that tradition by holding our monthly meetings on the first Friday of the month until a couple of years ago.

The Mobil Nobles went through several parade unit transformations. Our first task was to provide parade transportation for visiting Shrine dignitaries. In an effort to be known as a parade unit, we purchased two 1903 replica Oldsmobiles. In an effort to get more unit members in parades, we then purchased six two passenger pedal cars, which were great until we had to pedal up a hill. We then went to a four-unit Circus train with a unit member wearing a gorilla suit which was a great way to lose several pounds on a hot day. In 1990 we switched over to Indy style go carts which we drove up until 2007 when we made our final change over to the 5/8 scale sprint cars. We are grateful to the Detroit Lakes Color Guard for taking our sprint cars to keep entertaining parade spectators.

Perhaps the event that the Mobil Nobles were famous for was the annual Spaghetti and Meatball dinner held each year in March. The Mobil Nobles approached Joe DiBrito from Dilworth back in 1968 to try and put together a spaghetti dinner that we could use as a fund raiser. This was a most successful venture and we used 2nd, 3rd, and 4th generations of DiBrito family members and friends. Covid-19 rules and regulations along with a shortage of manpower ended this annual event.

We have left reminders of our unit involvement on the grounds of El Zagal. Two members of our unit have served as Potentate of El Zagal, Monte Routledge in 1989 and Drew Likness in 2006. Both of these individuals left landmarks at El Zagal during their terms of office. In 1989 the El Zagal Centennial Obelisk was put in place to honor those Shriners who were part of El Zagal's first 100 years. In 2006, the statue of a Shriner carrying a child known as the "editorial without words" was placed in front of El Zagal to commemorate our work with the Shrine Hospitals for Children.

The Mobil Nobles had a great run, and we suspect some of our members will be absorbed by other El Zagal units. We had 60 years of fun and fellowship all the while supporting the greatest charity of them all, The Shriners Children hospitals and clinics.

Are you aware that the 2024 cash calendars have been delivered? Some Nobles and Units are already out pounding the concrete selling calendars and helping their UNITS AND CLUBS raise fundsthat's right, I said UNITS AND CLUBS!

In case you haven't heard, there will be a kickback to ALL Units and Clubs that sell a minimum of 100 cash calendars for 2024.

This is a huge win across all El Zagal "Shrinedom" compared to the 1st-3rd place prizes for units in the past couple years, as it gives all units a more even playing field to raise funds.

Cash payouts are as follows:

\$2.00 a calendar if your unit sells over 100 calendars (If a Unit sells 100 to 300 calendars that would make the Unit \$2.00 per calendar earning them up to \$600)


\$4.00 a calendar if your unit sells over 300 calendars (If a Unit sells 301 to 500, they will jump to \$4.00 per calendar earning the unit up to \$2000)

\$5.00 a calendar if your unit sells over 500 calendars (After selling 501 calendars the earning goes to \$5.00 per calendar so at 501 calendars, the unit/club would earn \$2505)

If I were you I would grab some calendars from your Unit President and help raise funds for next year. The best news yet – there is no cap on unit sales, keep selling until inventory runs out!

Greetings from the Dusters. It has been a slow month for the Unit's social calendar, but we have had some very impressive achievements for a couple of our Dusters when it comes to the Scottish Rite and we would like to take this opportunity to recognize both of them.

Gerald "Gerry" Skogley was awarded highest Honor conferred by the Supreme Council of the Scottish Rite, The Grand Cross of Honor

The Scottish Rite confers honors on their members who have been outstanding in their contributions to Freemasonry, the Scottish Rite, and who have shown in their communities the leadership which marks them as men who exemplify in their daily lives the true meaning of service to others under God.

From 1872 to 2022, the Scottish Rite awarded only 323 Brothers the Grand Cross of Honor for their outstanding service to the Scottish Rite, their community, and country. Among them are a President of the United States of America, congressman and senators, admirals and generals, scientists and shipbuilders, actors, and teachers. There have only been three recipients from North Dakota, the last being in 1911.

At the same Scottish Rite biennial session, Dale Sandstrom was elected to be Sovereign Grand Inspector General for the Orient of North Dakota, Scottish Rite.

Myself and the Dusters couldn't be more proud of these two outstanding members and would like to thank both of them for their service.
