# SHRINE SUCCESS STORIES D TYSON WILLIAMS

Emily, a Bismarck Public Schools Empower[Ed] student, sat down with Misti Williams, Tyson's mother, to discuss how the Shriners have impacted their life. Read below to learn more about one of our many success stories!

Tyson Williams got involved with the Shriners when he was around three years old. The Shriners have helped Tyson and his family in more ways than they could ever imagine. When Tyson and his family got involved with the Shriners, they were in loads of medical debt due to Tyson's need for a prosthetic leg. Each prosthetic device costs around \$30,000-\$60,000. With Tyson growing like all children do, getting new prosthetic devices every six months to a year became a large financial burden for the family.





Prior to getting involved with the Shriners, the Williams' took out personal loans, as well as credit card loans, so they could cover the costs of the prosthetics. When Tyson's father passed away in 2017, everything fell on his mother's shoulders. They were barely getting by on a single income. In fact, the Shriners even saved them from becoming homeless at one point. Tyson's mom could not have done it without the Shriners help over the years.

Over his lifetime, the Shriners have been committed to doing anything they could to help Tyson walk. Tyson's mom, Misti, says "They have been a saving grace, from all the doctors, staff, POPs, the Shrine, and the members." Tyson would love to help other kids like himself, as an adult. He likes what the Pediatric Orthotic and Prosthetic Services (POPs) medical staff do as a career.

Tyson and his family got involved with the Shriners in 2016 after a fundraiser that did not go as planned. A local doctor, and former Shriner patient himself, heard about Tyson's situation and reached out to tell the family about the program. Tyson's mom Misti said, "that was the silver lining." They then were able to set up appointments with the Shriners, and have been with them ever since. Starting at age five, Tyson received prosthetic and surgery services from the Shriners. In addition, Misti expressed gratitude for support with meals and lodging. Tyson will always be a part of the Shriners family, as he continues to change and grow.





Tyson Williams is now 14 years old. He loves to play video games and be a typical teenager. His favorite color is red, and favorite animal is a sloth. Tyson is looking forward to trying out the throwing part in Track and Field this coming school year. Another thing he is excited about is visiting family back in Oregon.
