



SHRINE SUCCESS STORY

NATALIE TUFTE

From the age of 6, Natalie Tufte has received support from the Shriners. Natalie has Cerebral Palsy that extends all the way through her left arm and mainly affects her motor skills in her hand and wrist. Due to Natalie's Cerebral Palsy, every day activities prove to be more complicated for her. Carrying a lunch tray at school, opening a pickle jar, zipping her jacket, or tying her shoes are quite difficult. For Natalie, asking for help in areas she struggled in because of her Cerebral Palsy was one of the hardest things she had to learn.





INTRO TO THE SHRINERS

Natalie's family was introduced to the Shriners through a friend who was an orthopedic surgeon. Natalie received help from the Shriners for 11 years. The Shriners paid for all of Natalie's yearly check up appointments and evaluations, travel expenses, muscle therapy sessions, medical procedures and surgeries. Some of her check ups consisted of x-rays for her back. The doctors were worried that her Cerebral Palsy would lead to scoliosis causing her body to hover to the left.

Natalie also used band therapy for her wrist. The doctors would x-ray her back to check if her Cerebral Palsy was affecting her back. The band therapy was for muscle improvement. The occupational therapists helped pull and turn the wrist over to improve her fine motor skills, check muscle strength and movements. They also used weights to diagnose her muscle strength. The muscles are naturally weaker in areas of the body that have Cerebral Palsy.



Natalie's Surgery



When Natalie was 13, she had a pronator muscle release surgery. This surgery allowed her forearm to turn from the pronated position where the palm of her hand faced down to the supination position where her palm was able to face up. Her doctors made an incision in her forearm to access the pronator teres then cut the muscle. They muscle, releasing the spasticity. This surgery allowed Natalie better use of her hand, wrist and forearm. She was able to start gripping on to her tray at lunch without worrying that if someone bumped her, she would drop it.

After The Journey

Natalie has been very resilient during this journey to get to where she is now. She is working on becoming a clinical mental health counselor. In Natalie's process of working towards her future, she says how her arm is placed now won't stop her in the future or with future tasks. Natalie said during her interview, "I do not take pity on myself because I cannot do something, instead I find a solution to figure out the problem I have." Natalie knows there will always be certain things she cannot do, she said that she is okay with being vulnerable and asking for what she needs help with. She knows that she has to be aware of her surroundings to let people know when she needs the help.

Chief Rabban Warns About Internet Scams and Phishing

PSA - Various scams can proliferate on Facebook, including on Shriner and Masonic pages, and members should be aware of these to protect themselves. Every day people fall victim to scams on social media, including people who thought they'd spot a scam a mile away. The fraudsters are really good at what they do (they're professionals who have plenty of practice) and successfully trick lots of people who knew better, often because they start out simple enough (like a generic comment online then asking to connect and carry on the conversation). We love to talk all things masonic, but if you're not hyper vigilant you risk falling for their tricks. Here are explanations of some common scams on Facebook:

Phishing Scams

How it works: Scammers create fake websites or login pages that mimic Facebook. They then trick users into entering their login credentials.

Prevention: Always double-check the URL in the address bar to ensure you are on the legitimate Facebook website. Enable two-factor authentication for an extra layer of security.

Impersonation Scams

How it works: Scammers create fake profiles impersonating someone you know, often a friend or family member, and then attempt to trick you into sending money or revealing personal information.

Prevention: Verify the identity of unfamiliar profiles, and double-check with the supposed friend using a trusted method outside of Facebook if you receive suspicious messages.

Survey Scams

How it works: Users are prompted to participate in surveys that often claim to offer rewards or prizes. These surveys may be designed to collect

personal information or lead to malicious websites.

Prevention: Avoid clicking on survey links, especially if they promise unrealistic rewards. Be cautious about providing personal information online.

Fake Giveaways and Contests

How it works: Scammers create fake pages or posts claiming to offer giveaways or contests, asking users to like, share, or click on links to participate.

Prevention: Verify the legitimacy of giveaways or contests by checking the official page of the company or individual supposedly hosting it. Be skeptical of too-good-to-be-true offers.

Tech Support Scams

How it works: Scammers may pose as Facebook support or technical support, claiming that there's an issue with your account. They may ask for remote access to your computer or payment for fake services.

Prevention: Facebook does not typically reach out to users for technical support. Ignore unsolicited messages claiming to be from Facebook support. If you have concerns, go directly to Facebook's official help channels.


Romance Scams

How it works: Scammers create fake profiles to establish romantic relationships with users. They then exploit these relationships to request money or personal information.

Prevention: Be cautious about developing online relationships with strangers. Avoid sending money or sharing personal details with someone you've only met online.

Money Transfer Scams

How it works: Scammers may send messages claiming that you've won a lottery or inherited a large sum

Prevention: Exercise caution when clicking on links, especially those with sensational or misleading content. Stick to trusted sources for news and information.

To protect yourself from these scams, it's crucial to be vigilant, stay informed about common tactics, and use privacy settings to control who can interact with your profile and posts. If you encounter suspicious activity, report it to Facebook and, if necessary, law enforcement.






