Atlanta is known for its warm welcome to visitors, as well as its history, sights and diversity. This city is thriving, and that is spurring tremendous growth. In 2022-23, Atlanta was the third-fastest growing metro area in the United States. Atlanta history includes not only the legacies of the Civil War, but the triumphs of the 1960s civil rights movement. At the Martin Luther King, Jr. National Historical Park, just a mile from the Hyatt, you can visit his birth home and the historic Ebenezer Baptist Church, which in 2019 was restored to the appearance it had in the 1960s.

Atlanta is also home to the National Center for Civil and Human Rights, a museum dedicated to the achievements of the civil rights movement. It's located across Centennial Park from the World of Coca-Cola Museum and the Georgia Aquarium.

Centennial Park is right across the street from Centennial Olympic Park, the park constructed for the 1996 Summer Games.

Two other sites with historic significance just a short distance from downtown are the Atlanta History Center, in the Buckhead neighborhood, which features the historic Swan House, used as a location for *The Hunger Games: Catching Fire* movie, and the Jimmy Carter Presidential Library and Museum.

For those less interested in history there are the Atlanta Botanical Garden, with its unique flora, fauna and topiary, and The Varsity, billed at the "world's largest drive-in." They say no trip to Atlanta is complete without a Varsity chili dog, an order of onion rings and a Frosted Orange!
