

Hello to All Nobles and Ladies,


Now it's fall and most of you say "trees are turning", while us in my industry say "leaves are starting to drop". Same thing.



For four years, 20 nobles of El Zagal temple have been cooking up a storm as part of the Misfits BBQ club, but it hasn't been easy. They officially became a club in January 2020 - just before COVID hit-yet members persevered, operating "drive-thru" BBQ events with the help of social media. It was a huge hit, and the good times have continued toroll since then. But Misfits BBQ isn't just about gathering to cook and eat tasty meals, though. They provide low-cost or no-cost meals to good causes and participate in fundraising projects regularly. Nobles also focus on fraternal membership by assisting other units, clubs and events in addition to bringing awareness to Be a Shriner Now.

Shrine Success Story

About Bronwyn

Bronwyn Lundmark was born in Fargo, North Dakota and is the second child of three. Her older sister is 19 and her younger sister is 11. Bronwyn's father works as a mechanical engineer and during the time of Bronwyn's birth her mother was a substitute teacher in the field of Early Childhood Education before transitioning to a registered nurse. Bronwyn is now in middle school and a member of the speech team. Bronwyn likes to read and is also part of the 8th grade reading club that reads to 5th graders. When Bronwyn is at home she loves to bake and find tons of new recipes. She loves to find new recipes online and has quite a collection of recipe books. Bronwyn also likes to stay busy. She likes to go swimming, shopping, rides bikes a lot in the summer, crochets, loves arts and crafts activities, loves to travel, hike and crossfit.



Bronwyn's Story

While talking with Bronwyn's mom, Tanya, she said that her pregnancy with Bronwyn was very normal and she was born very healthily in 2010 as a spontaneous vaginal delivery without any drugs. Bronwyn was what appeared to be a normal infant to her parents and her doctors until she continuously stopped meeting her gross motor milestones. Her legs started to continuously bow so her parents knew something was most likely "wrong" with her physical development.



For instance, she was only sitting up and feeding herself at age one, not rolling, crawling, or even attempting to stand on her own. Her fine motor skills developed normally but her family noticed that she wouldn't cross her midline, like reaching across or kicking across her body during playtime. Bronwyn's parents also noticed she was more of a "floppy baby," meaning she had low muscle tone. Tanya spent almost two years seeking the "why" behind her daughter's difficulties. It wasn't until Bronwyn was referred to a pediatric geneticist in the fall of 2013 at Sanford Children's in Sioux Falls, SD that the family discovered Bronwyn had X-Linked Hypophosphatemic Rickets.

Around this same time, Tanya knew the family would be moving, so she searched online for facilities that treat pediatric patients with XLH closer to where they were considering moving to. She came across Shriners Children's Hospital on East River Parkway in Minneapolis, MN. Brownyn's very first appointments with a pediatrician, pediatric endocrinologist and pediatric orthopaedist were in the fall of 2013. She was 3.5 years old at her first visit and will remain a Shriners patient until she ages out of their care. Brownyn always has her height, weight and vitals taken during visits, and she walks and runs for her pediatric endocrinologist and orthopaedist. The goal set by her pediatrician and endocrinologist was to get her to 5' and she has surpassed that. Bronwyn had frequent, routine lab draws during appointments. When the Lundmarks first visited Shriners, they went for check-ups and lab draws every 2-4 months. After an extended period of time Bronwyn transitioned to visiting every 6 months. She has routine lower extremity x-rays to assess bone growth and routine ultrasounds of her kidneys. In April of 2018, the medication "Crysvita" was approved by the FDA. Bronwyn began bi-weekly injections, as well as routine lab checks to determine its effectiveness. Fortunately, the drug worked. She still receives these injections at home or in the local lab every three months to have her fasting serum phosphorus level checked. This happens to see if Bronwyn's Crysvita dosage needs to change.



It is important to note that XLH is a continual, life-long disorder, not one that affects the pediatric population only. There is only treatment, no cure. The incidence for this disorder is approximately 1:20,000, and it is classified as a rare disorder in the medical field. Bronwyn is a spontaneous case (otherwise known as de novo) and she will pass XLH on to roughly 50% of her children (if not all).

Shriners Help

The family firmly feels that with the assistance of Shriners, and the close knit bond they have formed with her physicians, Bronwyn has blossomed and grown into the spunky teenager she is today. Their role in starting her on medication they knew could help, even though neither drug was ever FDA approved for the treatment of XLH but were the only ones available, allowed for her growth, reduction in pain with physical activity, and an increase in her physical endurance. It is also through Shriners that Brownyn has met other kids with a variety of disorders at Camp Joy, who also receive treatment at Shriners. Had Shriners not been available, Bronwyn's parents are almost certain she would be severely physically limited and in pain the vast majority of the time. Brownyn would likely not be on Crysvita and she would not be doing as well as she is today. If Bronwyn's medical needs hadn't been met her parents fear thinking of what kind of mental state she would be in at such a young age.




