Looking forward in seeing you at the September meeting as we plan our upcoming schedule.

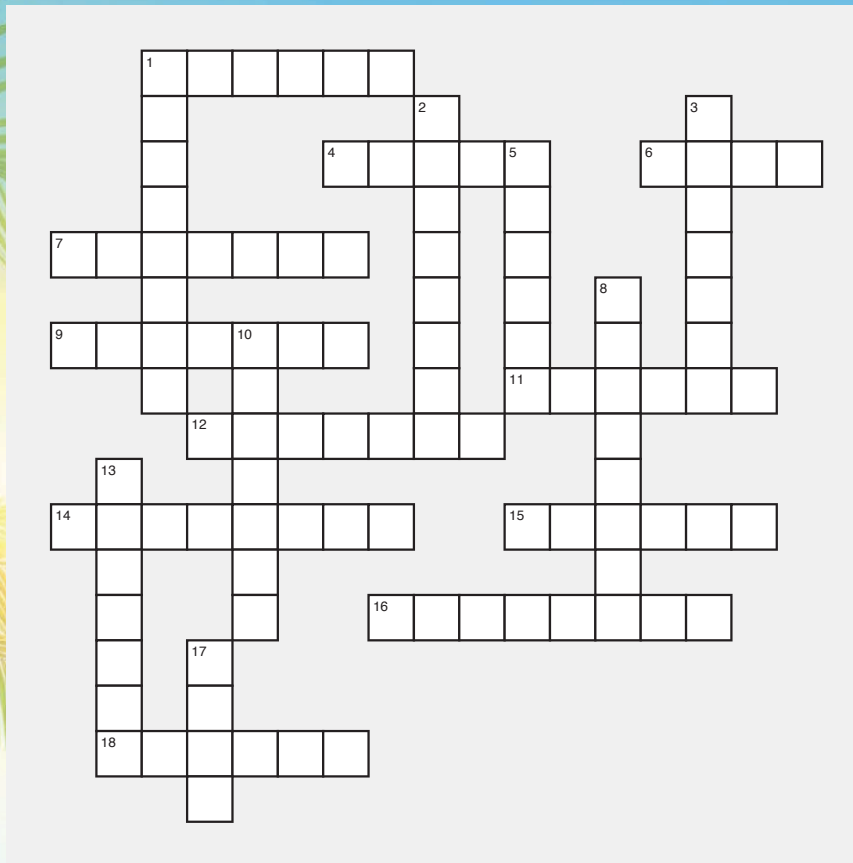

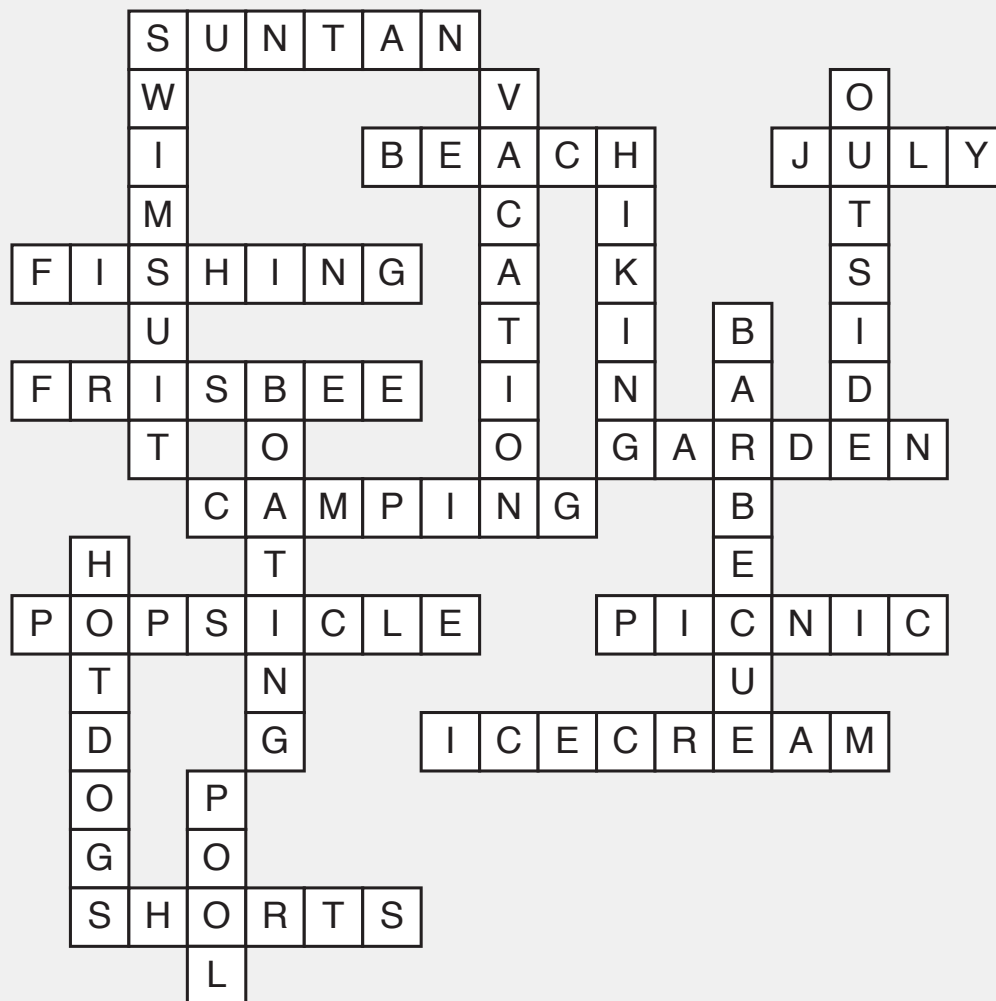
